

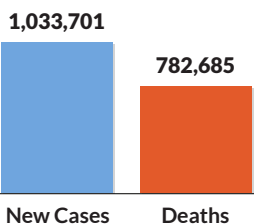


## A GLOBAL HEALTH CONCERN

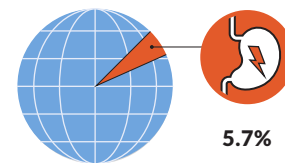

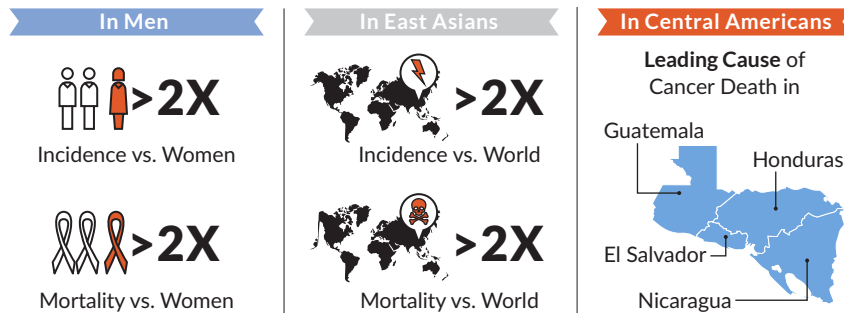
Stomach Cancer makes up only 5.7% of Cancer Cases worldwide



but is the **Second Most Deadly.** <sup>(8)</sup>

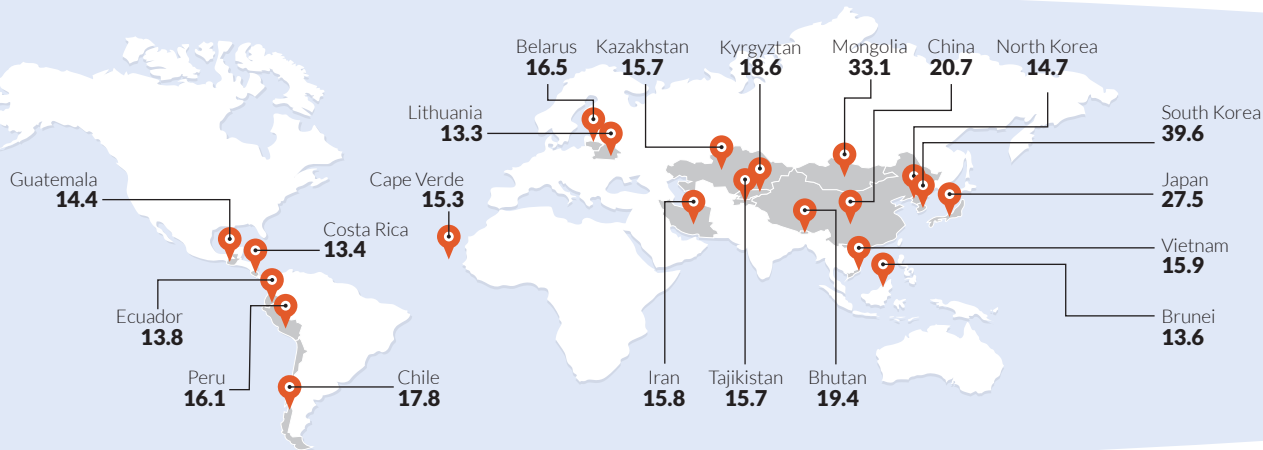


### Most Prevalent, Deadly for Men, East Asians, Central Americans<sup>(8, 9)</sup>



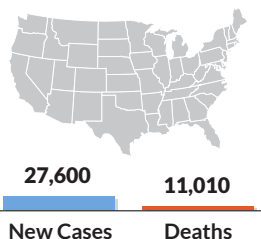
### Stomach Cancer Rates, Both Sexes

Per 100,000 Persons

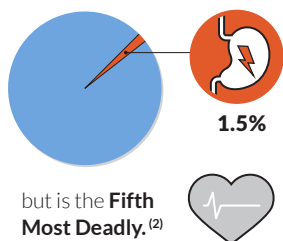

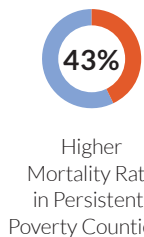
In 2020: <sup>(1)</sup>



Stomach Cancer makes up only 1.5% of Cancer Cases in the U.S.



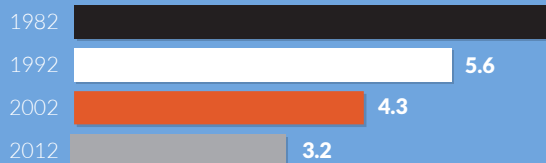
### Deadlier for the Poor and People of Color
